SOCIAL ACTIVITIES 2017

1. Tuesday 19 September 10.30 a.m. to 11.30 a.m. **Walking Tour of Queens Park**

The tour will be led by Bob Chalmers, president of the Essendon Historical Society. Come and join us for a leisurely hour-long stroll through our most beautiful park and learn about how it was transformed from a natural waterhole to a recreational area. Learn about John Oliver – the man who brought about the change – and the many features Queens Park has to offer today. If the weather is not suitable, we will relocate to the Sam Merrifield Library for a talk and visual display of the most interesting features of Queens Park.

Departure: The Tour will leave from the Cenotaph in Queens Park on the corner of Mount Alexander Road and Kellaway Avenue, Moonee Ponds.

Coffee/early lunch: After the tour of Queens Park, you might like to join others for coffee/tea or an early lunch, at your own cost, at the Curators Collective in Queens Park.

Cost: \$10.00, which includes a printed history of Queens Park. Money collected from this activity will go towards the restoration of the Moonee Ponds Court House.

This tour has a limit of 20 persons but no minimum is required for it to proceed.

2. Wednesday 27 September 2017 at 10.30 a.m. **Visit to the Victoria Police Museum**

The visit will begin with a 15-minute introduction, after which participants will be free to wander around the museum at leisure. The Museum's collection contains artefacts from the 1800s to the present day that reflect the diversity of Victoria's policing and criminal history. The collection includes two sets of original Kelly Gang armour, police uniforms and equipment, police medals, convict registers, prisoner records, mug-shots, crime scene photographs, confiscated weapons, police motorcycles, a bomb disposal robot and forensic evidence. At present there is an exhibition celebrating the centenary of women in the police force. For further information go to <http://www.policemuseum.vic.gov>

Location: World Trade Centre, Mezzanine level, 637 Flinders Street, Melbourne.

Lunch: After the visit to the museum you might like to join other participants for lunch in the café adjacent to the museum. This café does not take bookings.

Children attending: Children are welcome to accompany a family member on this activity provided the adult completes the permission slip for children accompanying a family member on a U3A Social Activity.

Cost of visit: Gold coin donation on the day.

The minimum number of participants required for this tour is 10 with a maximum of 20.

3. Friday 13 October 2017 at 11.00 a.m. Tramboat cruise to Southbank from Anglers Tavern

After leaving the Anglers Tavern landing the Tramboat will travel along the Maribyrnong River, passing Flemington Racecourse, the historic Footscray Wharves, and along the Yarra River under the Westgate Bridge to pick up 'gourmet' fish and chips at ScienceWorks for lunch on the boat. We will then travel up the Yarra River to berth at DFO South Wharf, where you can go shopping, enjoy a leisurely walk along South Wharf for an hour or stay on the boat. Tea, coffee and assorted slices will be served on the return trip along the Maribyrnong River to the Anglers Tavern. The Tramboat has a fully licensed bar on board.

Departure: The Tramboat will leave from and return to the landing at the Anglers Tavern, 2 Raleigh Road, Maribyrnong, at 11.00 a.m. and return at approximately 2.45 p.m.

Cost: \$55.00, which includes travel on the Tramboat, fish and chips for lunch, and afternoon tea on the way back to the Anglers Tavern.

The tour requires a minimum of 30 persons with an upper limit of 49 persons.

U3A MOONEE VALLEY 20-YEAR ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATIONS

SNIPPETS, SCRAPS AND STORIES FROM 2007 TO THE PRESENT

A LITTLE BIT OF HISTORY

Peter Laslett founded a self-help version of Frances's original University of the Third Age in Britain in 1982. This version of U3A was introduced into Victoria in the mid-1980s. By 2002 Victoria had 62 U3A groups running classes. The total membership in the state was 16,000. This figure has now grown to over 30,000 people of the Third Age enjoying ongoing learning in over 104 groups in Victoria. Many groups are now celebrating their thirtieth anniversaries.

In February 1997, with encouragement from like-minded friends, local resident June Williams held a meeting to gauge the interest of forming a U3A group in Moonee Ponds and an initial committee was formed:
