New Course

Since enrolments opened in January, a new course, to start in Term 2, has been added to our list. Jane Austen – Her Life, her Works, her Time will commence on the 9th of May and run for six weeks. Classes will be at Avondale Heights Library and Learning Centre on Tuesday afternoons. Jane Austen (1775-1817) and her relatively small body of work still enjoy enormous popularity: she is probably the most-read English classical novelist. Many of you will be familiar with her work through the numerous films and television series based on her books.

The course tutor, Christian Grawe, is eminently qualified for the role. He and his wife Ursula – who will also attend the course - have translated Jane Austen's complete works into German. In addition, Christian published, in German, both a literary guide to her novels and her biography. In the bicentenary of her Jane Austen's death, in 2017, Christian and Ursula conducted a tour of German bookshops, where they read from and discussed her novels.

Forum – April 18th, Windy Hill Voice to Parliament Referendum

Do you feel you know enough about the Voice to Parliament Referendum? Would you like the chance to explore its implications and ask questions? If you're seeking more information or understanding this is the forum for you. It will be presented by Dr Heather Wearne who is a volunteer educator with the "From the Heart Group." Heather is a retired academic who worked in tertiary education and she has much experience with indigenous issues

She will provide background information about the "Statement From the Heart" and the Voice. She'll talk about Constitutional recognition and the reasons why it matters so much to many First Nations Peoples. She'll also discuss what is at stake with the Referendum.

This forum will be held on Tuesday 18th April at Windy Hill Venue at the corner of Napier and Brewster Street Essendon. There is a free car park opposite in Napier Street and the venue is accessible by the No. 59 tram or Glenbervie or Essendon train stations.
